It was noted that Montenegro and Serbia had been cooperating successfully for 15 years already within the programme of cross-border cooperation with the support of the European Union, and that the cooperation would continue in the future as well, within the Programme Framework IPA III. "During the financial cycle that covered the period from 2014 to 2020, we contracted 28 projects of the total value of more than 7.7 million euros.
