GENERAL INFORMATION

The Ministry of Science requested support from the European Commission through the instrument “Horizon 2020 Policy Support Facility”¹, in August 2017. The project entitled “Towards Entrepreneurial Innovation Ecosystems in Montenegro” was kicked-off in June 2018. During the second half of 2018 intensive work has been done both at the side of the EU experts engaged and the project team in Montenegro. This event is marking the finalisation of the project and it is the opportunity to present the results but also to discuss with stakeholders from Montenegro and abroad about the implementation of the recommendations and creation of an effective entrepreneurial and innovation ecosystem.

ENTREPRENEURIAL AND INNOVATION ECOSYSTEMS FOR AN EFFICIENT TRANSITION TO KNOWLEDGE SOCIETY

The Government of Montenegro has started developing the innovation policies just recently. The Law and Strategy related to innovation were adopted in 2016. The first funding instrument aimed for commercial innovations carried out by the Ministry of Science in 2018, showed very optimistic results. The joint work of the EU experts and the Montenegrin Partnership for creation of the innovation ecosystem resulted in the adoption of the “Programme for supporting innovative start-ups in Montenegro 2019-2021” by the Government in December 2018. Innovation actors in Montenegro that were previously left to themselves, unconnected and without state support have responded very well to the new Government policies and instruments.

However, as the PSF analysis has shown, innovation policy in Montenegro needs to be set in a wider context and become fully integrated with entrepreneurship policies since the meagre entrepreneurial culture provides limited inflow of people into the system, to start with. Other elements of the system, such as

favourable legislation, new funding opportunities and better higher education and research environment need to follow and become much friendlier and open for innovation actors. These changes can increase attractiveness for foreign innovators and researchers, provide better internal and outward connectivity and increase foreign investment.

The situation in Montenegro is similar to other countries in Europe that are too slow in creating vibrant innovation ecosystems. However, Montenegro needs to learn and follow the leaders and thus be quick and pro-active in introducing mechanisms that will first slow down the outflow of entrepreneurial and innovation talent and later reverse it. Montenegro being a small country and potentially quick to change the framework conditions, is now in the position to create a turning point in its economy and base it on the grounds of knowledge, innovation and internationalisation.

The policy of smart specialisation should be conducive to this change as well, by defining a commonly agreed focus of research and innovation activity in connection to the business activities, and by aligning priorities with those determined at the EU trans-regional scale in order to provide for better global positioning of Montenegrin economy. The Smart Specialisation Strategy of Montenegro (S3) is expected to be adopted by mid-2019 in Montenegro.


PROFILE OF PARTICIPANTS:
