Francis Pirotta Creative Art Prize – 2019-2020 – Flags for Nature

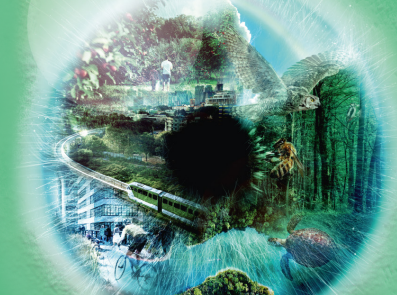
