

FOREST FIRE SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

FIREFIGHTING TABLE TOP EXERCISE SVAROG 2017



IF YOU ARE IN THE COUNTRYSIDE

- Don't burn trash or dry grass and twigs outdoors during the summer months.
- 2. Don't use outdoor grills in the forest or places near dry grass.
- 3. Avoid work that may cause a fire (welding or other tools that create sparks).
- 4. Don't drop lit cigarettes or garbage, especially glass, in the forest. There is danger of ignition.
- Respect access prohibition during periods of high risk.

IF YOUR HOUSE IS LOCATED IN OR NEAR FOREST

- Create a firewall around your house clearing a radius of at least 10m od dry grasses, leaves, pine needles and branches.
- 2. Prune trees to a height of less than 3m, depending on the age and condition.
- Remove dried branches from the trees and bushes.
- Don't leave tree branches touching the walls, the roof and the balconies of the house.
- 5. Prune to at least 5m away from home.
- Reduce tree foliage, so branches of a tree are at least 3m from the branches of another. For even more protection remove the tree and shrub vegetation around the building located within 10m.
- 7. Don't put plastic gutters or water pipes on the walls of the house or blinds of flammable materials in the windows and doors.
- 8. Make sure that caps on chimneys and airways to the house are made from non-combustible material that will not be penetrated by sparks.
- 9. Don't store flammable materials near the house.
- 10. Put firewood indoors or in sheltered areas.
- 11. Don't leave uncovered fuel containers near the house
- Buy appropriate fire extinguishers and make sure they are maintained
- Rig irrigation pipe or similar for the area to be protected with a hose and simple pump that operates without electricity

ONCE WE REALIZE THERE IS A FIRE

- Phone Operational-Communication Centre 112 of the Directorate for Emergency Management of Ministry of Interior (112) or Municipal Protection and Rescue Service (123) immediately
- 2. Give as much clear information as possible:
 - Exact location where you are
 - · The location and direction of fire
 - The type of vegetation burning



IF THE FIRE IS APPROACHING YOUR HOUSE

- 1. Don't panic
- Transfer all combustible materials from around the building to enclosed and sheltered areas
- 3. Close all openings (chimneys, windows, doors, etc.) so hot ash can't enter the house
- 4. Shut off gas supplies and/or liquid fuel supply in and outside the home
- 5. Remove awnings on balconies and windows
- 6. Facilitate access for the fire vehicles by opening gates
- 7. Place ladders against the outside of the house opposite to the direction of fire to give direct access to the roof
- 8. Connect water hoses to cover the perimeter of the house
- 9. If reduced visibility, turn on the internal and external lights to be visible through smoke

AS SOON AS FIRE PASSES

- Go from home and put out any smouldering remains of the fire
- 2. Check at regular intervals, the perimeter and outdoors for at least 48h for remaining fire risk

IF THE FIRE HAS REACHED YOUR HOUSE

- Don't abandon the building unless your escape is fully secured
- 2. Don't get in the car. The probability of survival in a house made of non-flammable materials is much greater than that in the car
- 3. If staying at home:
 - Close doors and windows
 - Block the cracks with wet cloths to prevent smoke getting through
 - Remove the curtains from the windows
 - Transfer furniture near windows and doors to middle of the room
 - Close the connecting doors to slow the spread of fire
 - Fill the bathtub, washbasins and buckets with water
 - Gather everyone together in one room
 - Make sure there are torches and spare batteries in case of electrical power failure
- 4. If the house is made of wood, seek refuge in a built house
- 5. If evacuation is ordered, follow faithfully the instructions of the authorities and the routes given

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
