EC Policy Priorities Based on the Political Guidelines for the European Commission 2019-2024 with a focus on three key priorities: Green Deal, Europe fit for the Digital Age, and Economy that Works for People as well as the new Recovery Plan, ERA and the ESFRI white paper

Objectives and Expected Impacts

Wider effects on society (including the environment), the economy and science, enabled by the outcomes of R&I outcomes (long-term)

Destinations

Packages of actions around which each Work Programme part will be designed, aimed at contributing to the objectives and expected impacts set out in the Strategic orientations.

The Destinations will provide the policy narrative for the calls and actions included in the WP.

Calls for proposals

Each Destination will be implemented by means of calls for proposals.

Each Call for proposals will include one or more topics, all with the same deadline.



Horizon Europe – Work Programme 2021-2022

- > Funding opportunities of €14.7 billion
- ➤ MSCA Actions and Research Infrastructures (Pillar 1), Clusters (Pillar 2)
- ➤ The first calls are open as of 22 June. Already in the Funding Portal
- Other components of Horizone Europe implemented through separate work programmes:
 - European Research Council
 - European Innovation Council
 - Joint Research Centre
- > 36% of funds will contribute to climate action; and 6.6% to biodiversity related policy objectives.




Novelties for Widening under Horizon Europe:

- Full alignment with new ERA strategic priorities
- Continuation of core widening instruments Teaming, Twinning and ERA Chairs with some improvements in response to lessons learnt
- Research cost for CSA eligible under Teaming, Twinning and ERA Chairs
- More emphasis on developing research management capacities
- Full integration of COST under widening, 80% of actions must have significant widening dimension
- Fixed list of eligible Member States to host the main beneficiary (EU13 + PT + EL) + Associated Countries
- EU Outermost Regions fully eligible to host the co-ordinator
- Full implementation of "Advancing Europe" package with a number of additional support schemes to boost participation of less research performing countries
- More integrated policy approach and enhanced synergies with regional policy, transnational missions, regional smart specialisation strategies etc.

Destination #1: Improved access to excellence

Objective: to create a portfolio of complementary actions that will build R&I capacities in Widening countries enabling them to advance to the competitive edge at European and international level.

Main impact:

- Increased science and innovation capacities for all actors in modernised and more competitive R&I systems in widening countries
- Reformed institutions and increased attractiveness for talents
- Higher participation success in Horizon Europe and more consortium leadership roles
- Stronger linkages between academia and business and improved career permeability
- Strengthened role of the Higher Education sector in research and innovation
- Better involvement of regional actors in R&I process
- Improved outreach to international scale for all actors



Destination #2: Attracting and mobilising the best talents

Main impacts:

- Inciting institutional reforms in research institutions in widening countries
- Better use existing research infrastructures and populate them with excellent talents
- Attract first-class talents and turn them into game changers in institutions
- Revert brain drain
- Improved linkages between academic and business, notably by overcoming sectoral barriers
- Free circulation of knowledge and expertise in line with ERA priorities

Widening participation and strengthening ERA - foreseen actions

Objectives:

- Raise the bar for excellence of all R&I actors in the region
- Enhance networking activities between the research institutions of the Western Balkan countries and leading counterparts at EU level
- Enhance the S&T capacity of the WB institutions



Activities to be supported:

- a) short-term staff exchanges;
- b) expert visits and short term on-site or virtual training;
- c) workshops;
- d) conference attendance;
- e) organisation of joint summer school type activities;
- f) dissemination and outreach activities.

As far as appropriate these activities should take into account the gender equality plans of the participants.



Expected outcomes of project results:

- Improved excellence capacity and resources.
- Enhanced strategic networking activities between WB research institutions and at least two internationally-leading counterparts at EU level.
- Raised reputation, research profile and attractiveness.
- Strengthened research management capacities and administrative skills of the staff.
- Improved creativity and increased mobility (inwards and outwards)



The Twinning proposals:

- should include arrangements for formulating joint research project(s) in the scientific area of choice and describe how Twinning will take this research to a new stage.
- Explain how the leading scientific institutions in the partnership will to new research avenues, creativity and the development of new approaches, as well as acting as a source of increased mobility of qualified scientists.
- Substantiate the benefits for the leading scientific institutions and how they would materialise through the partnership.
- Pay attention to gender equality objectives.
- The research part of the project should be presented through a dedicated work package and plan including the scientific objectives, tasks and roles of the partners.

Admissibility:

- Applications must be submitted **electronically** before the **call deadline** via the Funding and tenders Portal.
- Applications must be **complete** and contain all parts and mandatory Annexes and supporting documents.
- Applications must include a plan for the exploitation and dissemination of results including communication activities, unless provided otherwise in the specific call conditions.
- Page limits will be clearly shown in the provided templates in the portal for CSA the limit is 30 pages.



Entities eligible to participate:

To be eligible for funding, applicants must be established in one of the eligible countries, i.e.:

- the Member States of the European Union, including their outermost regions;
- the Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs) linked to the Member States
- eligible non-EU countries:
- countries associated to Horizon Europe;
- low and middle income countries



Consortium composition:

Legal entities forming a consortium are eligible to participate in actions provided that the consortium includes:

- At least one independent legal entity established in a Member State; and
- At least two other independent legal entities, each established in different Member States or Associated Countries.

Exceptions:

The coordinator must be a legal entity established in one of the following countries: AL, ME, BiH, KO, MK and RS.

Furthermore, at least **70%** of the budget for research activities must be allocated to the coordinator from the above stated eligible countries.

Entities eligible for funding:

Any legal entity, regardless of its place of establishment, including legal entities from non-associated third countries or international organisations is eligible to participate provided that the conditions laid down in the Horizon Europe Regulation have been met, along with any other conditions laid down in the specific call topic.

A 'legal entity' means any natural or legal person created and recognised as such under national law, EU law or international law, which has legal personality and which may, acting in its own name, exercise rights and be subject to obligations, or an entity without legal personality.



Financial and operational capacity and exclusion

Applicants must have:

- **Stable and sufficient resources and capacity** to successfully implement the projects and contribute their share. Organisations participating in several projects must have sufficient capacity to implement all these projects.
- Know-how, qualifications and resources to successfully implement their tasks in the project and contribute their share.
- Applicants that are subject to **EU administrative sanctions** (i.e. exclusion) or are in one of the **exclusion situations** that bar them from receiving EU grants can NOT participate.



Award Criteria:

Excellence

- Clarity and pertinence of objectives
- Quality of the proposed coordination/support action and methodology
 Impact
- Credibility of the pathways to achieve the expected outcomes
- Suitability and quality of the measures to maximise the impact

Quality and efficiency of implementation

- Quality and effectiveness of the work plan and resources
- Capacity and role of each participant and consortium as a whole



Scores and weighting:

- Evaluation scores will be awarded for the criteria.
- For full applications, each criterion will be scored out of 5. The threshold for individual criteria will be 3. The overall threshold, applying to the sum of the three individual scores, will be 10.
- Proposals that pass the individual threshold AND the overall threshold will be considered for funding, within the limits of the available call budget. Other proposals will be rejected.



Procedure:

The procedure is described in General Annex F. The following **exceptions**, rules for dealing with ex-aequo applications apply:

- In the first place, ex aequo proposals will be prioritised according to geographical diversity criteria, as indicated in Point 4) of General Annexes Part F (Procedure/Evaluation procedure and ranking).
- The method described in 1), 2), 3) and 5) will be applied to the remaining equally ranking proposals in the group.
- This rule establishing the priority order serves to better spread the impact of the action and to strengthen the efficiency of the 'Widening participation and spreading excellence' programme
