

The university is located in Constanța, the largest city in Dobrogea and Southeast Romania, which represents a cultural bridge between East and West, an eastern gate to the European Union.

Constanța has continuously developed over time and is nowadays the largest city in the region. The history of the University begins in 1961, when Constanța Pedagogical Institute was established.
